" 'Movers and Shakers':

Tulsa Alumnae's Valued Matriarchs [and one Patriarch]"

Dorothy Bowen Gideon

While Dorothy Bowen Gideon may not be as familiar a name to modern-day SAIs, the role she played in the formation of Tulsa Alumnae Chapter cannot be underestimated. A 1932 initiate of Sigma Gamma Chapter, two years later Dorothy joined the alumnae group of Sigma Gamma graduates as an active, participating member. In those days, before Tulsa Alumnae Chapter came into being, SAI alumnae identified themselves as resident or non-resident Sigma Gamma alums and were given their own section in the yearbooks of those long-ago days. In early 1940, a group of those ladies began to envision being an official alumnae chapter. Following the steps required for the formation of an alumnae chapter, including forming a group of at least fifteen alumnae members in good standing, the SAIs who would become charter members of Tulsa Alumnae Chapter petitioned the National Executive Board for a charter. Thus, in 1941, Dorothy Bowen became the group's first duly elected president and is still listed in that leadership role in the listing of former alumnae presidents found in modern Tulsa SAI yearbooks. The November 1941 issue of *Pan Pipes* lists Dorothy as Tulsa Alumnae "group's" president, the first such listing for Tulsa alums in the fraternity's national journal. Naturally, Dorothy was there when Tulsa alums received their charter in 1943. A pianist and theoretician, Dorothy taught in the TU School of Music, her teaching specialty being second year Theory and Harmony. At the time of her death in 2006, her family established a music scholarship at TU in her memory.

In Memoriam: Dorothy McFadden

Dorothy McFadden, a Patroness of Sigma Alpha Iota and a 1983 initiate of Sigma Gamma Chapter, passed away on October 16, 2018, at the age of 103 years. She was a member of SAI for over 35 years.

After her initiation, Dorothy joined the Tulsa Patroness Chapter and was an active participant in Patroness activities until 2012.

A graduate of Kansas State Teachers College (now Emporia State), Dorothy majored in piano performance and piano pedagogy. Her career in Tulsa was teaching private piano lessons, inspiring literally scores of young pianists who came under her careful training. An article in the *Tulsa World* dated January 10, 2015, and marking Dorothy's one hundredth birthday, noted that at that time, Dorothy had been teaching piano in Tulsa for sixty years! The photos which accompanied the article showed Dorothy in her favorite position, seated at her grand piano.

Dorothy was a longtime member of Wednesday Morning Musicale, Hyechka Club, and TAMTA, as well as SAI.

In 1985 and again in 1986, Dorothy hosted all three Tulsa chapters—Sigma Gamma, Tulsa Alumnae, and Tulsa Patronesses—in her home for Incorporation Day observances and musicales. In 1990, TAMTA presented Dorothy with a special honor plaque in recognition of over four decades of private piano teaching. During the 1980's and 1990's, Dorothy often accompanied the Tulsa Opera chorus rehearsals and Metropolitan Opera regional auditions.

Dorothy's final performance took place three days before her passing, when family members visited her at her assisted living apartment at Tulsa's Methodist Manor where they were treated to Dorothy's playing for them one last time.
