"WHAT I LEARNED READING K. MARIE'S BOOK"

"History, SAI Style" by Sue Amstutz

Keeping the Archives of Tulsa Alumnae Chapter has been one of the great rewards of this writer's SAI experience. Administering, documenting, and providing information about our chapter has heightened my appreciation of the 70+ years of Tulsa Alumnae's illustrious history. K. Marie Stolba had the same reverence for the history of our entire Fraternity as she researched, compiled, wrote, and edited the comprehensive Centennial volume, *Sigma Alpha Iota: A History*.

Why has history been such an integral part of SAI? ARTICLE VI, Section 5, of the 1926 National Constitution states that "a history shall be published at such times as the National Convention deems necessary." The Fraternity is directed to cover every detail which might be of interest to the membership in the form of written documentation.

There have been seven written histories of SAI, several of which were published as issues of *Pan Pipes*. The first, a Silver Anniversary Issue, appeared in March 1928 . . . our Tulsa Alumnae Archives includes a copy! A Fortieth Anniversary publication appeared in 1943, followed by a Golden Anniversary Issue in November 1953, a Sixtieth Anniversary Issue in May 1964, and a 75th Anniversary Issue in May 1978. Next came *Sigma Alpha Iota:* 1903-2003, edited by Ethel Bullard, which appeared to mark SAI's 90th Anniversary. K. Marie Stolba's Centennial History celebrated SAI's 100th Birthday, the most recent Fraternity history to have been written.

In 2028, when the Fraternity observes its 125th Anniversary, we might wonder to whom the task of bringing the history of Sigma Alpha Iota up-to-date will be given?


Zeta A Province Yay: "Forever A Rose" 🦼
